President

President John Gravendyk called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The President requested and received a quorum of 9 officers and trustees present. The minutes of the August meeting were approved. John thanked Rick Gaspar for presiding over the August general meeting and Round Table.

Old Business:

Kerry Hodges who, with Stephanie Hagen, is helping to manage planning for the annual <u>Christmas party</u> submitted a menu plan.

Bob Birkner, tasked with helping new members integrate into the club and utilize their individual talents, submitted several suggestions:



- Use mentors to interview and introduce new members to all Committee Chairs who can describe their committee's volunteer tasks/needs, or;
- Select appropriate Committee Chairs based on interests determined during interview;
- Committee Chairs accept/reject members to their committee;
- Mentors give feedback to the Membership Committee;
- Insure chairs are following through on this plan of action.

Bob identified specific projects in both the youth and conversation areas, presenting comments from Andy Batcho, who works with the Washington State Duwamish-Green Chapter Trout Unlimited, on engaging members in chapter projects.

Pat Becker suggested club projects to target older groups, such as explorer, search & rescue, or police groups.

New Business:

Treasurer/Webmaster Jim Goedhart

Jim Goedhart weighed in on engaging new members and offered that the club website is a good tool to set up projects for new members. Jim will present a report at the next board meeting listing interests of both new and established members. This list can presently be found under "Members Report" on the website.

Jim suggested two new items be added to the website:

- Capability to choose seating at banquets and special events;
- Dave Schorsch's presentation on Puget Sound Cutthroat Fishing to the "Tips & Tricks" section.

Jim said that plug-ins (apps) are costing the club \$534/per year.

Chuck Ballard requests a report on budget demands for the upcoming Christmas party. Jim will have those figures for the board at the meeting in October.

<u>1st VP – Membership</u> Rich Gaspar

Rich Gaspar reported he has three prospects for membership. Rich said that current members are not stepping up as mentors, a critical part of engaging new members.



Club members can do more in personally contacting new members about upcoming outings and inviting them to personal fishing outings.

A persistent question when it comes to the mentorship program is to define what the responsibilities are. Rich will develop a more definitive explanation of those responsibilities and present it to the board in October.

Meanwhile, the club's current membership is at 141 with a goal of 200.

Bob Burdick presented an overview of the August Round Table: 47 members and 2 guests attended.
