BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

TREASURER Kurt Peterson

Kurt was not present for the board meeting. He submitted the monthly treasurer report to the president and secretary via email on May 7th.

MEMBERSHIP Jim Beck

Jim reported that 121 people have paid their membership fees, leaving 31 who have not paid their membership fees. A letter will be sent to members who have not paid informing them that their membership has been suspended. A club brochure will be included with the letter. Dan will mail the brochures to Jim B so he can include them in the letter mailings. If unpaid members wish to reinstate their membership, the cost of reinstatement has been raised to \$100.

Dan has met with the presidents of other fishing clubs and inquired about their strategy for collecting dues. Some clubs use Square to invoice members when it is time to pay dues. Dan is very interested in decreasing the amount of time spent collecting dues.

PROGRAMS Neal Hoffberg

Neal reports that monthly meeting speakers have been booked for the year and he is now working on next year. David Williams has been booked for March, 2024. He will talk about fly fishing in Washington from the desert to the sound. Ryan and Michael from Grant County will also present next year.

At the June dinner meeting, Molly Semenik and Marian Hiller will discuss casting. Their presentation will begin at 4:00 at Luther Burbank Park. Participants are welcome to watch, and/or practice casting. The focus of the instruction will be single and double hauling. Jim G will send out a blast email regarding where to meet (most likely the north parking lot).

Following the hands-on instruction in the park, the meeting and additional presentation will continue at the VFW Hall. Molly would like to speak first so that she can leave early as she has a long drive back to the Youth Academy. Marian Hiller will present the Boyd Aigner award as he was her father as well as one of the most
